



BRIEF REPORT ON PAST PROECTS



2005-2006 1ST AND 2NDAFRICAN YOUTH PEACE & DEVELOPMENT COMEVENCE

In 2005, AYGF organized the 1st African Youth Peasce and Development Conference in collaboration with the defunct Federal Ministry of Cooperation and Integration in Africa, Institute for Peace and Confict Resolution, National Commission for Refugees, Federal Radio Corporation of Nigeria, Mr. Bigg, with delegation form all the African Countries.

The International Conference brought together youth leaders from across the continent to discuss on issues of continental peace, security, good governance, cooperation and

integration from the perspective of the youths.

Also in the year 2006, AYGF held the 2nd African Youth Development Conference; in collaboration with the Ministry of Cooperation and Integration in Africa. The success and participation was double of the 2005 edition. Since then over 20 conferences have been facilitated by the Foundation.

2014-2015 ECOWAS SEE PROJECT

The SEE Project was jointly implemented by Africa Youth Growth Foundation (AYGF) and Activating the Lost Dream Foundation (ALDF) and funded by ECOWAS and the Spanish Fund on Migration. The project sought to combat the ignorance of the ECOWAS Free Movement Protocol as a critical factor reinforcing trafficking in persons (TIP) activities in Idiroko border community through sensitization community residents especially women and children on the dangers of human trafficking. Appreciating the critical role of women in societal development, the project will also empowered a population of women within the community through entrepreneurship and vocational skill acquisition trainings. The training focused on vocations such tailoring and fashion designing, computer and secretarial service delivery, hair dressing, baking and bead making. Sequel to the training, beneficiaries were guided and empowered (through donation of equipment and award of seed funding) to establish small scale businesses (vocations) which will serve the community. Through this project, over 10,250 Nigerians (indirect beneficiaries) were sensitized through campaigns, social media engagements, and traditional media, the skills of 350 (Direct Beneficiaries) women and youth were enhanced on Catering Service, Tailoring, Hair dressing and the use of computer. This lead to a reduction in the rate of crime and smuggling at the

2019-EXTENSION OF LABOUR INSPECTION ACTIVITY AND LABOUR LAW ENFORCEMENT TO SECTORS AND WORKPLACES WHERE MIGRANT WORKERS MAYBE PRESENT



AYGF in the year 2019 - 2 020 implemented the Extension of Labour Inspection Activity and Labour Enforcement to Sectors and Work Places Where migrant Workers May Be Present. The project was funded by the European Union Through the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and implemented in tandem with the Federal Ministry of Labour and employment (FMLE) and the Nigerian Immigration Service (NIS). The major objective of the project was to carryout base line survey to ascertain the level of compliance and conformity of Labourlaw enforcement in the Country vis-a-vis the migrant workers in Nigeria and access how that has impacted on the welfare and wellbeing of migrant workers in Nigeria in the context of implementation and compliance with National

Policy on Migration, National Policy on Labour Migration and other International Labour conventions and treaties. The project was successfully completed and the final project report has been published by the International Organization for Migration (IOM), copies of the report will be disseminated strategically in libraries, Ministries, Agencies and Schools for public knowledge and research for the report is the frst of its kind in the history of Nigeria.

A total of 626 migrant workers filled the questionnaires, A final report on the spread/data of migrant workers was published for public consumption/ resource material disseminated in Schools, libraries, Ministries etc.









2020- CAPACITY BUILDING OF BORDER OPERATIVES FOR MIGRANTS PROTECTION PROJECT (CABOMP)

AYGF with funding from the European Union through the International Organization for Migration (IOM) implemented the Capacity Building of Border Operatives for Migrant Protection (CABOMP), The main objective of the project is to ensure improved migrant protection and human rights conditions in Seme (Lagos), Jibiya (Katsina), and Mfum (Cross River) border, through this project the knowledge and understanding of border operatives on issues of migrants' rights was enhanced. The project was implemented in tandem with the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), Nigerian Immigration Service, and National Agency for the prohibition of trafficking in persons (NAPTIP)

The knowledge of 250(direct beneficiaries) Border officials was enhanced on the rights and privileges of Migrants at the select Borders. Also, the project had 4,550 indirect beneficiaries through the step-down training conducted by the officials including though the traditional and social media.

2020-MIGRATION INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION CAMPAIGN MICC-NIGERIA PHASE I

The MICC Nigeria phase I project is funded by the German Government Through the Federal Foreign Office, the project was design to address issues of irregular migration and its attendant consequences in Nigeria. The project implemented in Edo State Nigeria and Abuja FCT in the year 2020, through the project AYGF carried out the following activities;

- Advocacy visit to over 30 stakeholders between Federal Capital Territory and Edo state
- Ten 10 media groups (TV, Online radio and Newspaper) were engaged during the MICC Phase 1
- The Nigeria MICC Phase 1 online webinar had 40 participants and speakers from NCRFMI, NAPTIP, German Embassy and a serving Legislator
- 68 participants were present during the MICC Nigeria Town Hall Meeting in Benin, Edo State. The stakeholders pledged to improve sensitization on irregular migration at all levels.
- 160 participated in the MICC Nigeria Debate and Essay Competition with 10 winners for the debate competition and 10 winners for the Essay competition with cash rewards worth total of 2 million naira

The project succeeded in mainstreaming issues on irregular migration within 10-35 year old demography who are most vulnerable to irregular migration and trafficking and all the dangers associated with it. Through this project a total number of 5,825,000.00 million Nigerians were sensitized on the dangers of irregular migration and regular pathways.

2021-MIGRATION INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION CAMPAIGN



The Migration Information and Communication Campaign (MICC-Nigeria II) project, seeks to deliver improved awareness and higher level of understanding on the dangers and implications of Irregular Migration including Trafficking-In-Persons and Smuggling of migrants in the Country.

The project which has Delta state and the FCT as the focus, has an Online Debate/Quiz Competition, Road Show, Town Hall meeting, Social Media and Traditional Media campaigns including the use of select number of celebrities as key outreach strategies.

The project IS funded by same German Government through Federal Foreign Office upon successful completion of the pilot in the year 2020 (MICC-Nigeria phase 1).

The project succeeded in mainstreaming issues on irregular migration within 18-35 year old demography who are most vulnerable to irregular migration and trafficking and all the dangers associated with it. Through this project a total number of 7,650,000.00 million Nigerians were sensitized on the dangers of irregular migration and regular pathways.

ACCELERATING NUTRITION RESULTS IN NIGERIA-ANRIN



The Accelerating Nutrition results in Nigeria (ANRiN) IS a World Bank funded project being implemented by AYGF to address issues of Malnutrition in Nigeria. The overall objective of the project is to increase the utilization of quality cost effective nutrition services for pregnant and lactating women, adolescent girls, and children under the AGES of 5. The project is currently being implemented in 13 LGAS in Niger State (8 LGAS in Niger South and 7 LGAS from Niger East) and 10 LGAS in Kogi (9 LGAS from Kogi East and 1 LGA for Kogi Central).



AYGF is currently participating in the Public Private Partnership under the World Bank Better Education Service Delivery for All (BESDA) in the selected States of Nigeria. The objective of the BESDA Project is to increase equitable access for Out-of-School Children to improve literacy level as well as to strengthen accountability for results of Basic Education in Nigeria, the project seeks to provide technical assistance to identify, recruit, enroll out-of-school children back to school, monitor their progress performance, ensure the children are retained, and complete their studies within the lifespan of the project.

AYGF have secured partnership with the Government of Gombe, Oyo and Niger State who are already on board participating in the BESDA project which is being sponsored by the World Bank.



EARTH RESTORATION CAMPAIGN (ERC)

COVID-19 ACCEPTANCE AND PERCEPTION SURVEY -(COVAPS)



The Covid-19 Vaccine Acceptance and Perception Survey (COVAPS) is a Household/individual Survey, designed and funded by the Africa Youth Growth Foundation (AYGF), the overall aim is to determine the current acceptance level and perception surrounding the reception and uptake of the Covid-19 Vaccine in Nigeria, including practices and knowledge base of Health workers administering the vaccine.

The objective of this survey is to evaluate, assess and ascertain the rate of the Covid-19 Vaccine intake amongst Nigerians with Kogi and Niger state as a pilot phase, the factors limiting and the perceptions of Covid 19 Vaccine to individuals.

The survey will be adopting a voluntary respondent style with a Focused group Discussion (FGD)/ questionnaire approach to collect relevant data.

The expected outcome of the Survey is that the acceptance level of Covid-19 vaccine in the Survey location ascertained, the perceptions surrounding the vaccine intake determined, knowledge base and routine practices among Health workers administering the vaccine also determined. Furthermore, key Barriers to vaccine acceptance will be identified and a comprehensive information guide for the administration of the Covid-19 Vaccine will be provided in partnership with relevant stakeholders which include but not limited to:
